



February 2026 Saint Louis University/YouGov Poll Results September 2026 Revision

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Saint Louis University and YouGov surveyed 900 likely Missouri voters from February 9 to February 22 about current political issues in Missouri. The following pages present results for most survey questions. The margin of error for survey results for the full sample is 3.91%. Methodology and Weighting

YouGov interviewed 1,448 Missouri (MO) registered voters, with the goal of screening for and surveying Missouri likely voters. The Missouri registered voters were then matched down to a sample of 1,085, yielding a target subsample of 900 likely voters including 450 from each treatment group. The respondents were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, and education. The sampling frame was constructed by stratified sampling from the Missouri subset of the 2024 Current Population Survey (CPS) 1-year sample with selection within strata by weighted sampling with replacements (using the person weights on the public use file).

The matched cases were weighted to the sampling frame using propensity scores. The matched cases and the frame were combined and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity, years of education, and home ownership. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and poststratified according to these deciles.

The weights were then post-stratified on 2024 presidential vote choice as well as a four-way stratification of gender, age (4-categories), race (4-categories), and education (4-categories). The weighted dataset of 1085 registered voters was then subsetting to the 900 likely voters, and the weights were trimmed and recentered around 1, to produce the final weights.

Sample size: 900 with a credible interval of ± 4 percentage points. This survey has an estimated design effect of 1.22 yielding an effective sample size of 737.
